Two Kinds of Verbs


Every sentence has at least one **VERB**.

In some sentences, the subject does something. These sentences contain **ACTION VERBS**.

examples: Two actors danced across the stage.
After that, a woman with red hair sang a solo.

In other sentences, more information is given about the subject. These sentences contain **LINKING VERBS**. Linking verbs connect the subject to a noun or adjective in the predicate. The noun or adjective renames or describes the subject.

examples: The actors were students from my school.
The woman with the red hair appeared nervous.
