A **direct object** is a noun that receives the action of a verb.

example: Sophia reads **books**.  
The subject of this sentence is Sophia.  
The action verb is reads.  
The direct object tells what she reads.  
She reads books.




Here is how you make a diagram of a sentence with a direct object:


